NEXT STEPS

As Larry DeVilbiss enters the final six months of his two-year assignment to train and to mobilize new workers for recording projects particularly in Mexico, Nigeria, and Indonesia, it is important for us all to look at how we can plan to carry this work into the future. What are the next steps?

The GRN USA Board sees that Larry directing the mission from the other side of the world is less than ideal. It would not have been possible without the loyal and faithful support of Interim Assistant Director John Steinmetz and Operations Director Dan Rulison. We appreciate them both.

To refine our management structure, Larry DeVilbiss is stepping aside as Executive Director, and assuming that responsibility, effective December 1, is Dr. Skip Garmo.

Larry will continue managing overseas recording projects, focusing on the heaviest concentrations of unrecorded languages. Mexico and Nigeria already have promising new recordists and recording outreaches. Currently in Indonesia Larry is researching partnerships that may give GRN an unprecedented number of new youth to focus on recording unrecorded languages in that country.

We know from experience that there is a cost to reaching and recording unrecorded languages. Including training, equipment, travel and recording costs, and the time and talent of the recordists and the language helpers, we arrive at pretty close to \$1,000 per language. Concentrations of unreached languages as in Nigeria (500) and Indonesia (1,000) make us realize that we need the wisdom of the Lord as much as any time in the history of this mission.

If we are serious about sharing the "Story of Jesus in Every Language," we must face these realities and conquer some challenging giants. We triumph first on our knees in obedient, faithful prayer. But we must also obey the Lord's direction as a mission. A fervent youthful workforce could be mobilized and financially enabled in Mexico,



Nigeria, Indonesia ... but that is something we invite you to join us in tackling.

Because of the worldwide budget crisis that affects us also, GRN USA will match funds for gifts that are given for these recording projects (see next page).




From Dr. Skip Garmo:

RECORDING TEAM UPDATES

<u>Our Buenas Nuevas team</u> had a successful outreach in Baja in early October. Before that, our busy recordists, Francisco and Ariadna, went to southern Oaxaca with several vans full of young people from Mexican churches; they all did outreach in camps and on beaches. Several languages were recorded.

Francisco writes: *I got home two days ago, after more than half a year away from home recording and researching.* Fran is supposed to record one month, be home one month, as he has a healthy coffee crop to keep up with, the proceeds of which form a large part of his support and his family's. Please remember these hard-working young people who are giving time from their lives so sacrificially for the Lord's work.



Update on Nigeria

Kish Hai Bai, Director of GRN Nigeria, writes:

We will be leaving for the yearly medical outreach on Thursday Nov. 17th. This is phase one [of our yearly Christmas outreach]. Banditry and kidnapping are on the increase these days. However, we are not discouraged. Phase two is on December 26th-30th. This project is harder than the normal distribution outreach. Pray for success.

We add: pray for safety for these men! And for their families while they are away.



Larry's surprise visit (Indonesia)

Yesterday a recent university graduate, a gifted techie, came tearfully and asked if she could work with us. This was totally unexpected because when just a couple of weeks ago we asked if she would consider working with us, she essentially told us that she wanted to get a well-paying job so she could help her family. She also said she really wanted to run her own life. That was a pretty definite answer but we prayed a lot because she has been working with us on word lists and getting the Story Producer app training, and she did well and seemed to enjoy it.

So when she showed up yesterday morning I was surprised that we had a noncersation about her coming into the work. More than once she was wiping tears from her face. Obviously God had worked deeply in her heart. Thanks for your prayers.

INCREASE OUR FAITH!

Excerpts from a letter by Larry DeVilbiss:



Due to a budget that is already overspent, we have just told Nigeria that there may not be funds available for their ambitious recording schedule. But here I am in Indonesia contemplating starting up a program twice as large. Some may say, "There he goes again." I keep hearing Jesus' words: "But I say unto you: the fields are already white unto harvest!"

With an estimated 1,000 languages that still do not have the Gospel recorded in this country, the stakes are high. And yet the opportunities seem to abound.

We hope soon to visit a school of Teen Mission, with whom we have a memorandum of partnership. We plan to address the student body and staff about our recording program, and to do a recording demonstration. We would like to get them all on 5fish. Present and listening to us will be graduating students, alumni, and third year students qualifying for year-long working internships. We hope to get many directly involved. However, with budget constraints, how do we approach this opportunity?

We are waiting on the Lord for His provision. We believe God will speak to specific donors and will move them to help support these recording projects. God will also bring the workers the ministry needs. Phil 4:19: "And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus."

I feel my part is to share the vision and to be honest about the situation.

Lord, increase our faith!

how GRN benefits in a secondary way is the possibility of discovering speakers of unreached languages... again, right here in our own land. Another thing we see is groups of people from many countries who come to the US as immigrants or students. Some of our staff are already seeking language helpers from among them. Pray!
