Imagine two large wedding tents bustling with representatives from every Christian mission you can think of, then double that for those you've



yet to learn of. The reps chattered excitedly, setting up their colorful displays, banners, and flowing streamers. It was a Fair, a joyous gathering of missionaries come to meet the next generation. One student was a tiny bundle of questions from Indonesia. She started the conversation as many of the international students did. "I don't think you have MY language!" It was a pleasure to see her amazement as we

brought up the language varieties we have from Indonesia and found her very own. "But do you have Mandarin?" She asked. She smiled when we opened 5fish to the plethora of resources in Mandarin. Her face softened and she told me of her grandparents who spoke nothing but Mandarin. Her grandmother had indicated an openness to Jesus, but she was unable to tell her grandmother about the Savior because she did not speak Mandarin. "I'm going back to Indonesia this summer. Now I will be able to tell my grandparents about Jesus."

Next a tall young man from India challenged 5fish to produce his language variety. Again, 5fish came through, showing teaching available in his heart language. He was so excited he beamed and threw his head back in amazement. I noted that there was much more that could be recorded in his language and he leaned forward with enthusiasm. "I know many dialects, and I would be happy to record for you." We exchanged contact information and look forward to even more people hearing the saving story of Jesus our Lord.

Some even approached the GRN table hesitantly as they had previously decided to join Frontiers, Send, or another wonderful mission. What a privilege to tell them that whatever mission they joined, and whatever country they went to, we have tools for them to use. It is our honor and privilege to assist them in their ministry. All hesitance fell away and so very many eagerly learned more about Global Recordings Network and downloaded 5fish, sharing it with friends who also came to hear.

May God bless those many who have gone before in the recording of languages from the people of the world that His name and salvation might be known. And may God bless these who now take the fruit of that work and carry His name to far off places in this and future generations. We give thanks to God for this precious opportunity and the divine appointments He provided.

One student was interested in volunteering with our IT department. He knows Java Script which is vital for a new project.

Both singles and families with children enjoyed the presentation of how media has changed. We demonstrated the CardTalk (hand turned cardboard record player) and on to 5fish app and our Tumi Tiger which holds a solar charged mp3 player in its tummy.

I was thrilled to meet with my wife's nephew who was part of the worship team that played from 1 to 5 am! It was so encouraging to see students seeking the heart of God.

NEW TOOLS EMERGING

How We Got on the Map

I love to watch a symphony orchestra play on YouTube. It's a picture of teamwork. Each performer looks different and may play a unique instrument or even a separate melody, but all perform in perfect harmony to produce a beautiful piece of music. Our GRN mapping project team is like a symphony orchestra. Each team member "plays" their part and contributes to the big picture (or map.)

Thousands of Languages

GRN's motto is *Telling the Story of Jesus in Every Language*. I thought about thousands of language varieties spoken worldwide. I asked myself, "Wouldn't a **language map** be a tremendous help in locating these groups?" *Of course, it would, but I don't have the training or skill to make one.* After prayer, probing, and patience, God led step by step.



Out-of-date Maps

Years previously we obtained permission to use language maps created by Wycliffe Bible Translators. Now they were out of date, so I asked Loren, a mapping specialist from another mission, to show me how to update them. It proved to be overly complex, but Loren offered to do the job. Instead of a static map, printed on paper, he proposed an interactive global map showing the location of recorded and unrecorded languages. This was far bigger than my original idea.

The Pieces

Several pieces needed to come together – the electronic base map, a point (dot) showing the location of each cluster of language varieties, and the GRN-related info about each language. Don't forget the players.

The Players Come Together

Loren recruited more mapping experts. I trained several data-entering volunteers. Others searched documents for pertinent information. Another volunteer produced a code to harmonize data with the mapping software. We sought to avoid any sour notes or "dis-chords" by obtaining permissions and keeping within copyright restrictions.

Click and Listen

Now, anyone can use this link to find information about any language. They can click on a green dot and listen to recordings in that language. A red X indicates a language that needs a recording.

You're invited to the concert. Actually, it's more like a rehearsal than a performance because this map is a work-in-progress. You can help. Tell us how well each instrument is playing. To do so, enter the link below into your computer browser. (If you don't know how, ask a teenager.) Here's the link -<u>https://gis.lightsys.org/grn</u> - and the QR code.



You Are the Audience

When the Interactive Global Map comes up, first **click on the question mark** in the left-hand column for a video explaining the functions. When you are ready to give your review, **click on the gearwheel** in the left-hand column.

Another way you can help is to pray that those red exes will soon turn to green, indicating that the story of Jesus is now being told in another language. Let's make music – and maps – together.

"And what do *you* do?" somebody once asked me. I grinned. "I wave my arms around like the conductor, but I can't play any of the instruments!" But the truth is, God is the conductor, and He has brought all the players together, for which we praise Him.
