

WHAT IS THE "HEART" OF GRN?



What is the purpose of the ministry we call Global Recordings Network?

As the world shocks and shifts around us, we are thankful that our feet stand upon an unmoving Rock—Jesus Christ. We are entering our 85th year of existence, and many things have changed: we don't wear long skirts any more, or press records, or carry heavy reel-to-reel tapes to go recording ... but some things remain the same. Our heart at what used to be called Gospel Recordings has always been reaching the "last, least, lost" with the Good News of Jesus in every language.

Our basis for believing this ministry is important to God is revealed all through Scripture, but one unforgettable passage is Rev. 7:9.

After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people, and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb.

The thought that we will some day be praising the Savior all together around His throne keeps us going!

Heart is not the entire body. As an organization we do many other things: distribute our recordings or partner with others who do so; make special recordings for specific reasons (example: Tumi Tiger recordings for endangered or traumatized children around the world); support field work in most of our large centers worldwide. BUT... every living organism needs a heart, and our heart at GRN has always been making simple tools to share Jesus Christ in oral form for all tongues, particularly small and ignored language groups.

While mentioning the heart, we cannot forget the blood supply — prayer! It is needed for every "cell" -- every single part of this ministry. Blood carries oxygen, and what "air" brings to mind is the Wind, the Inspiration, the Holy Spirit. Without His enriching, enabling presence, we die as an organization, just as the physical body would die without blood's life-giving oxygen.

Pray, will you? Pray for this 85-year-old ministry, which exists today to bring glory to God and growth to His Kingdom. Pray for its heart, for its leadership, and for us to be found faithful 'til He comes and we gather around that Throne!

DIRECTOR'S DESK

International Purpose

Our Executive Director has just attended the quadrennial International Council meetings overseas and weighs in with some international perspective.

Jan and I recently returned from Thailand, where we shared 11 days of meetings – morning, noon, and night – with GRN leaders from 20 other countries at what we call "Council." Several serve in sensitive settings, so I am resisting the temptation to print group photos. Nonetheless, what a blessed privilege and responsibility it was to worship, debrief, discuss, eat, and plan together!

As you can imagine, mixing that many cultures together for that length of time added a unique and wonderful flavor to our gathering. Thanks for continuing to prayer for us. God blessed that time graciously and significantly.

One morning during worship, all 45 of us prayed "The Lord's Prayer" together, each in their own language and all at the same time. What a foretaste of the future reality of Revelation 7:9!

God continues to show us that He has ongoing plans in mind for GRN. People are praying. Supporters are giving. Ministry doors are opening. And our enemy is warring. Yet, as we noted one morning in worship, "...we are afflicted...but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair..." (I Cor. 4:8).



Several noteworthy decisions were made at Council: (a) We elected a new International Director for the next four years, USA board member Tim Strauss; (b) I was appointed to the International Leadership Team; (c) Kish, our GRN Nigeria leader, and I signed a renewed agreement that we both pray will guide GRN Nigeria and GRN USA to an enduring and fruitful partnership. Kish is on my left in this photo and Joshua, his protégé, on my right.

RECORDING UNRECORDED LANGUAGES

Needles in Haystacks

GRN was started 85 years ago by an unstoppable little lady named Joy, who tromped through jungles, crossed crocodile-riddled rivers, prayed for the impossible, and saw God accomplish it over and over. For decades, recordists across the globe have kept searching for the last unrecorded languages.

The 5fish app now contains Gospel messages, Bible stories, and teaching in over 6,500 languages of the world. Recordists through the years have emulated Joy's unstoppable spirit by going where few have gone. They faced difficult circumstances, ferocious spiritual warfare, illness, bugs, unfamiliar people, climates, and cultures. They carried recording equipment and not much else as theirs was a faith mission, dependent on the gracious hand of God to provide every bite of food and any possible shelter.



The same scene is replayed today throughout the world in all of GRN's centers and bases. Recordists go out to search for the unrecorded languages of the world because of the importance of hearing the Gospel message in one's own heart language. A heart language, the tongue in which their mother spoke to them, is filled with nuances and memories that second languages just cannot possess. Did God not allow the then-known world to hear the Gospel preached by Peter (Acts 2:5-11) all in their own language? There was a reason for that. The Holy Spirit touched their hearts in a very special way and over 3,000 were saved in one day.

Today, technology has boomed not only in the secular world, but in the world of Christian missions as well. The new GRN MapApp provides the ability for recordists standing on any spot in the world to see what languages are around them, whether they have been recorded, whether they need more recording, in other words: where to go next. It's invaluable when finding those last, most hidden people who also need the Lord.

This new technology allows researchers to identify where the Church needs to

turn its attention. In a surprising turn of events, the data tells us that 96.8% of the earth's people still live in the country of their origin. However, that leaves 218 million people who are refugees and immigrants in countries NOT of their birth — many of them right here in the USA. God loves them too and would not have any eternally lost.

Today, finding these hidden people within our borders is indeed like searching for the proverbial "needle in a haystack." It sometimes takes months or years to uncover an unrecorded language among the immigrant population. There are trust issues, some have




escaped from violence, and fear is common. How can we find these people?

Recordists in the US are approaching ethnic churches with requests to help in the search for language varieties. This is sometimes met with excitement and sometimes with dismissal, just as with American churches. For those ethnic churches excited to help and guide us to an unrecorded language variety, we thank God. For this "needle," this precious language, is a door not only to those immigrants in our country, but to spirits, hearts, and minds of many across the oceans in far places we might never reach.

A needle sews things together. It sews two sides sturdily into one. This is what we search for, a language that has the capacity to bring together heaven and earth, the temporal and the eternal, the human and the divine, the eternally lost and the eternally saved and transformed. Won't you pray with us for not only the far-flung unrecorded tongues, but also those within our very borders? Pray for our neighbors, our brothers and sisters within Christian church walls, immigrants and refugees who can reach across borders to friends and family.

Pray, dear friends, that we all might sew (and sow!) the beautiful Good News of Jesus Christ the King and His incomparable saving love in every language group over all the earth.





IDENTIFYING THE TASK

From our Language Tracking department:

We ask if you will please consider praying regularly for the <u>38 groups</u> on this page that may be the last languages in the world with absolutely no Christian witness to them. Only much prayer can pave the way for <u>these most difficult groups</u> to be addressed. Pray for our teams around the world as they first pray, then create strategies to meet these needs, then

go. "With God, ALL things are possible."

This chart represents thousands of hours of thought, research, refinement, and prayer by hundreds and hundreds of Christians around the world. Large ministries dedicate time and effort to gather information about people groups all over the globe. Missionary surveyors, explorers, and church planters give their lives to finding and making contact with these groups. Others raise up prayer support for the effort to bring the Good News that Jesus saves.

Any list such as this is, by its very nature, changing all the time. New info is received: current info is refined or corrected; new groups receive attention from Christians doing outreach; a few languages even become "dead" and then extinct. This chart of people groups is fluid, and can only ever represent the reality on the ground: that there are still groups of souls for whom Christ died who have not yet heard even His Name.

Please PRAY!



SHARING 5fish CARDS

I have been using your '5fish' cards, in either Spanish or English, as if they were complete Gospel tracts. I give them out with brief explanations when I make small purchases anywhere, or when I am stopped at official (or non-official) check points, with strangers at yard sales, or stores, always with a brief explanation, which often turns into a longer conversation.

Ruth L just gave 5fish cards to her high school friend, Mrs. Spencer of Iowa. She texted Ruth: "I handed two 5fish cards to a woman and a 'Hope' tract to a checker at the store. I've been setting out more tracts & 5fish cards... Your visit inspired me!" Ruth: "PRAISE THE LORD!"

I have used ordinary Gospel tracts but I have noticed that these 5fish cards are very well received. I believe it is because they put the opportunity in the hands of the recipient to find and receive something of value (for instance the two hour Jesus movie, or a Bible translation on their telephone) and it's in their own hands for them to pursue. They also provoke questions, not the least of which is "Can I keep this card?"

Only one person has refused the card, out of nearly 1,000 that I have distributed. And that was an individual who declared that he had no telephone, computer, or television, and had decided not to have them for economic reasons, and so would not profit from that connection. Even so, we had a pretty good conversation about the Love of Christ.

On some occasions, bystanders, hearing our conversations, have requested cards for themselves, or recipients have requested more than one card to pass on to family or friends.

SHARING OUR HEART

In a recent devotional*, Andrew Palau suggests we ask ourselves,

"Where's my heart?

Is my heart set on filling my bank account so that I feel safe? Or do I recognize that true security is in Jesus alone? Paradoxically, the only way to keep our most valuable assets safe is to surrender them to Jesus.

Ask Him, 'Lord, how do You want me to spend my time, my money, my gifts, my life?' Be alert to see how He is leading you — even if that means giving something away. In God's kingdom you ... surrender to Him completely and He promises treasure in Heaven that cannot be destroyed."
