Remember that stone you tossed into a lake or pond when you were young? You could see concentric circles (actually, tiny waves) as they spread out from the point of impact, going on for quite a distance—much farther than the size of the rock.

The impact of Gospel audio recordings is something like that. They are small tools, perhaps, in the hands of those who minister, but they have the potential to impact lives in



a big way. Recordings, done well, definitely can "make waves" in a culture (see p. 10). Indeed, we hope they do, and that the Lord will "...manifest through [the hearers] the sweet aroma of the knowledge of Him in every place (2 Cor. 2:14).

Pray that our recordings "in every place" around the world will be impactful and also will bring glory to the Lord who "leads us in triumph in Christ."

Distribution of Pyam was successfully carried out in several different communities, including Mungi, Nyengu, Bwalbwang, and Pumbush. The Pyam recordings were played



several times in many places, and numbers of people gathered to listen attentively. From their faces you could see how enthused they were.





Those with Android phones were able to get the 5fish app installed onto them while the evangelists, pastors, Language Committee members, and others were privileged to be entrusted with MP3 Players, SD cards, and Good News flip charts for ongoing use in their communities. These materials were received with joy and the workers feel privileged to be using them for their intended purpose.

Some pastors testified about the great impact these heart language materials will create in their churches, considering the large number of members who cannot understand the trade language (which has been the major means of communicating the Gospel in most churches in the land).

One of these pastors went ahead and pledged to create time within his church service to play some of these recordings every Sunday. During the outreach, the Jesus Film in Pyam language



was also projected at the market square where both Christians and Muslims viewed it en masse. The 5fish app was so amazing to many as it avails them the opportunity to access the Gospel not only in their language but in other languages as well, which to us means the promise of **"Gospel unlimited"** in this area.



Pray that God will touch the hearts of many Pyam people through these simple recorded messages in their language. Their villages are often receiving attacks from outsiders; pray that God will keep them secure.

We praise God for a successful distribution. Thank you all for your partnership.

Partnering Ministries in Mozambique

Hi Dalene, Thank you so much for your message that comes with good news. To let you know the impact these audio Scripture sets are making, here is one story: a few days ago, a Catholic priest told me that he went to a funeral and instead of using their normal ritual procedures, the community asked him to play the biblical passage that talks about the death and resurrection of Lazarus. He said after playing, he was surprised by the positive response of the people, both Christians and non-Christian.

After receiving this message, our office donated some of the Oral Scripture sets which Wycliffe translated and asked us here at GRN South Africa to co-distribute as much as possible. But the requests kept coming.

I shared this with a partnering ministry, *Audio Scripture Ministries*, and as I write this, they're able to distribute more Scripture sets on Megavoice playback devices in this vast area.



We could easily use a million devices. The languages recorded are variant speech forms representing the larger Makhuwa group - around four million people. The Makhuwa varieties include the following: eMeetto, eMarrevone, eMakhuwani, eNaharra, and eXirima. We can't really know someone else's heart, but we do realise that the outcry is not just for another gimmick. The people show earnest need to hear the content, to learn more. They repeat it and share it with others.

Pray with us for the people living in Northern Mozambique — still a rather unstable area. Let's pray for something great to happen here.

We have been praying and exploring opportunities to tell the story of Jesus in Indian languages ever since our Indian office closed several years ago. We are thankful for a finance



volunteer from India who connected us with a ministry in Southern India.

Rev. Johnson, ministry director, and his team are seeking to make disciples in a caste of potters who speak the Kumbhar language. The Kumbhar language has never been written and its speakers are poor and poorly educated. There are few Christians and no Christian resources available in this language.

We are working with their team as they translate, record, and edit our *Look, Listen and Live* series into Kumbhar. Our studio team will then process and program the messages so that Rev. Johnson and his team can use the audio-visual Gospel recordings in their ministry.

Please pray for the successful production of useful recordings so that the Kumbharspeaking potters will come to understand the Good News, repent, and become disciples of Jesus. Please pray. We praise God for raising up a number of generous people who have fully funded this project.

Report from Togo

In a group of elderly people where traditional beliefs are deeply rooted, a woman we now call "Grande Maman" shared a story of a radical change in her life. Formerly a voodoo fetishist, a prosperous trader, and homeowner, she had long remained silent in the face of Biblical messages delivered in her native language of Ewe. It was only after five years of listening that she decided to give her life to Christ and join a church.

ORGANIZED GROUP OUTREACH

In one of the agricultural camps in this Mexican valley, we ministered to men, mostly from Chiapas, speaking Tzotzil and Tzeltal. The night before our visit, when we screened the Jesus Film in the Tzeltal language of Oxchuc, a Tzotzil woman was assaulted by her partner while under the influence of drugs. She cried out to God for help and relief, and God answered her plea. Hours later, the Project Hermosillo team arrived at her camp. Two women from our

team shared the Gospel with her in her own language, and she was ministered to, helped, and encouraged. When one of them encouraged her to speak to God in her own language (Tzotzil), she cried out with an overflowing heart before God's presence. All of us involved saw God's work in her life, the work of the Holy Spirit.

This is why we were brought to Hermosillo and its surrounding areas: that God may be glorified. Thank you for praying! —*from Project Hermosillo 2025*

The purpose of this project is to provide Christian Hadiyyas with a centralized, easily accessible source of spiritual and cultural content in their mother tongue.

While narrating Bible stories in Hadiyyisa, I came across the remarkable work your organization has done. I have viewed the Hadiyyisa material available on your website and was deeply moved by the

quality and dedication evident in your efforts. Your contributions are a tremendous blessing to many in the Hadiyya community, especially those who are not literate and thus rely heavily on audio-visual resources. —*April 2025*

Crazy or Obedient?

TIBET, CHINA

Stephanie Vernon, a little lady in her fifties, was typing address labels in the office of a Christian ministry in California when the Lord told her to go and witness to the Dalai Lama, the god-king of Tibet.

Some thought she must be crazy since she had no finances and was suffering from a kidney disease. But she was convinced that God wanted her to reach Tibetans with the Gospel.

Stephanie left for India with just a few hundred dollars in her purse, a round trip ticket, and a sixty-day tourist visa.

Those 60 days turned into 20 years of ministry among Tibetan refugees in several countries along the southern border of Tibet. During that time she visited almost all of the Buddhist monasteries in the region, giving out New Testaments to the monks. And she did meet with the Dalai Lama—several times.

Years ago, we were privileged to supply this dear servant of God with a record player and some phonograph records. She wrote: "I lugged that little player and records over the Himalayas and grinded the thing until my arm became numb. Because I played it so much, I wore out the needles, so I really hoarded the spare needles as if they were made of gold. I don't believe that I missed one Tibetan Camp. Eventually, I donated the player and records to one of the Tibetan monasteries—my precious little record player, which had become so very dear to me through the years. Without it, I could not have preached the Gospel to the hundreds and hundreds of Tibetan refugees."

Praise God for all the Tibetans who have heard of Christ because recordings were made in their own language, and for people like Stephanie who followed God in obedience.
